Curriculum Area



Focus for learning

This term we will be linking our Literacy work to our topic 'From field to fork'. We will be writing instructions, including how to make bread and plant a seed.

There will be a real focus on using capital letters to start sentences and a full stop at the end.

Phonics:

We teach and learn phonics every day. Each week the children will learn new sounds and revisit sounds already learnt. In June the children will be doing the Phonics test which tests their ability to sound out and blend 40 different words.

How you can help at home

Talk to your child at home and model good conversational skills such as listening, taking turns and speaking in full sentences. Read lots of different stories and discuss the events of the story. Chant the alphabet to learn the letter names and learn the sound for all phonemes (letter blends eg; s, a, sh, ch. Talk to your child about the phonemes, 'tricky' words that we have been learning at school and practise spelling these.

You can help at home by playing online games with your child to help them practise.

Maths



This term we will continue focus on place value and counting forwards and backwards up to and beyond 100. Also we will consolidate our addition and subtraction skills. Multiplication and division are part of the Year I curriculum and we are developing knowledge of the 2, 10 and 5 times tables this term. We will also be learning to find a half and a quarter of numbers and shapes.

Help your child to recognise the numbers 0 to 100 and spot numbers when you are out and about. Whilst playing games at home, or at any appropriate opportunity, encourage your child to count in a stable order. with 1:1 correspondence. Help your child to notice shapes within their local environment. Talk to your child as you weigh or measure things at home. Use the clock at home, tell them the time and encourage them to tell you what time it is as they become more confident.
